Gaming has always been a big favourite with children of all ages. This week's article looks at the very popular PS4 PlayStation and its services. The console is very similar to other platforms in that it no longer just offers game playing, but a full entertainment experience. This includes gaming online with other users, chat, watching movies and purchasing of 'add-ins' for existing games. For parents there are a number of safety features that can be utilised to help provide a safe entertainment system for your children. The National Online Safety organisation has released a guide which explains how to use the master account and parental controls to limit play time, spending on extras, age limit on content and the communication features.
