Dear Parents and Carers,

Yesterday we received guidance from the Government about opening schools to all year groups from September. Within our community there will be mixed emotions about this, but I want to reassure you that full risk assessments will be completed, and all plans will be communicated to you by the end of term. As you know we have been educating Year 10 and Year 12 from school since 10th June giving us the opportunity to test the robustness of our health and safety procedures. I can confirm that they are proving to be easy for the staff and students to follow and are highly effective. The safety and wellbeing of your children is paramount and is at the centre of our planning.

Attendance

The guidance states that the attendance of all students is mandatory from the first week of September 2020 and that usual rules on attendance will be applied. Parents who have serious concerns or feel extremely anxious about their children returning to school are advised to contact the school to talk about the measures that are in place to reduce the risk to their child. The Government are very clear that pupils of compulsory school age must be in school unless a statutory reason applies. If a child shows symptoms of Coronavirus, or is isolating because they have been in contact with someone who has had symptoms and been tested as positive then the child should not attend school and the correct absence code will be applied.
